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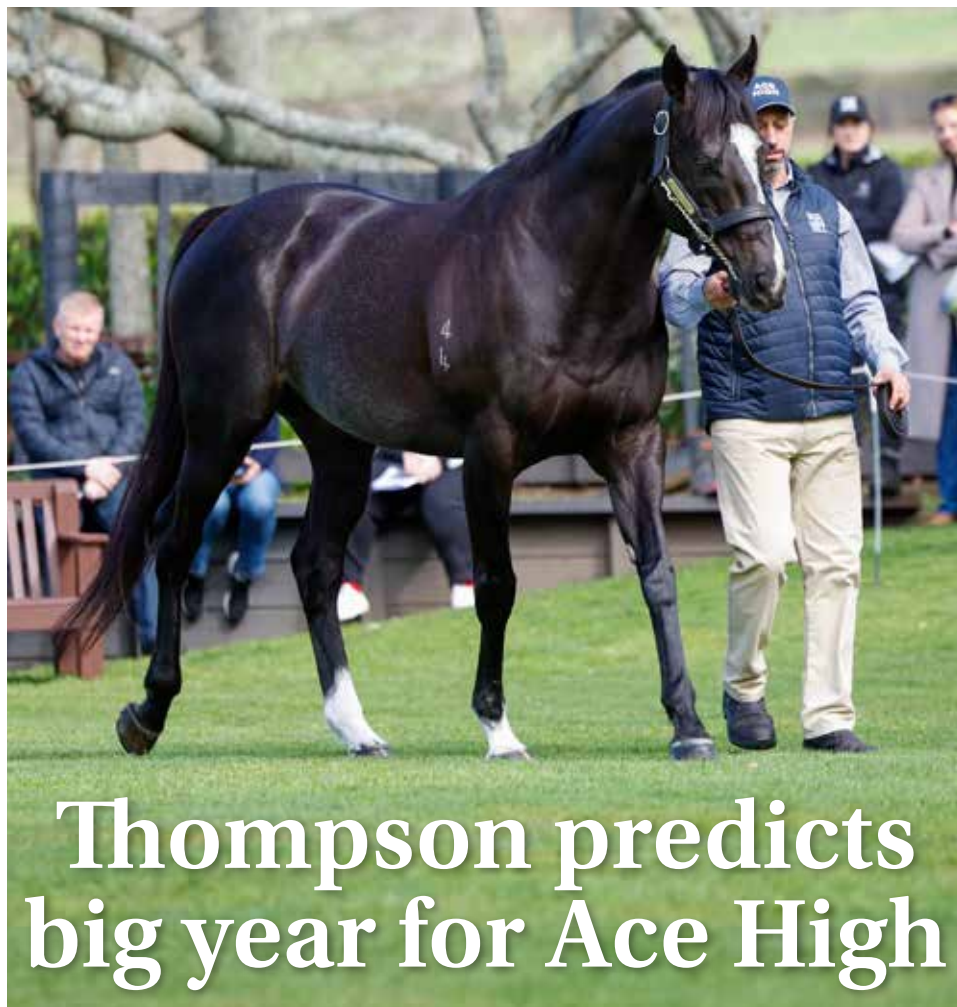

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Thompson predicts big year for Ace High

Exciting three-year-old Blind Raise's (Ace High) dominant win in Saturday's McKenzie Stakes (Listed, 1300m) not only stamped him a potential star of the spring but a leading light in what could be a boom time for his sire.

That's the opinion of John Thompson of New Zealand's Rich Hill Stud, who says Ace High (High Chaparral) is starting to build some highly impressive momentum.

The 12-year-old dual Group 1 winner had experienced something of a lull last year, with his book of mares dropping by almost half as breeders waited to see a little more, from 120 in 2024 to 67.

But that's turned around sharply now.

Following a wait of more than two years after his first elite winner, his daughter She's A Dealer became his second one in March, taking Manawatu's New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m).

Ka Ying Rising dazzles in record sprint success

David Hayes declared Ka Ying Rising (Shamexpress) "bigger, stronger and better" as the world's best sprinter shattered Sha Tin's 1200-metre track record for the fifth time before immediately entering quarantine on Sunday in preparation for a defence of The Everest (Gr 1, 1200m) in Sydney next month. **Continued on page 15**

Continued from page 2 the gelding Blind Raise emerged, blitzing his Sandown debut and following up with a black type victory in Flemington's Anzac Day Stakes (Listed, 1400m) for two-year-olds, by two lengths.

And deep into last spring, a little late to spark an upturn for his 2025 breeding season, Ace High's daughter She's A Hustler won three of four starts including Moonee Valley's Tesio Stakes (Gr 3, 2040m) and Caulfield's Zipping Classic (Gr 2, 2400m), with a second in Flemington's Matriarch Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) in between.

All of this helped Ace High post some eye-catching statistics for Australia's 2025-26 season.

For stallions with 20 or more winners, he ranked second by his stakes winners to runners ratio, with three from 38 at 7.9 per cent. Only Darley shuttler Ghaiyyath (Dubawi) was ahead of him, on 8.6 per cent.

And by his winners to runners ratio (again for stallions with 20 or more winners), Ace High topped the charts, with 24 from 38 at 63.2 percent. Former Coolmore shuttler Justify (Scat Daddy) was second, on 62.4 per cent, with 73 from 123.

Overall, Ace High now has a solid global SWTR ratio of 4.51 per cent, with six from 133, while in Australia it sits at 6.38 per cent, with three from 47. In New Zealand, he has four from 95.

His 2026 surge in results not only moved Rich Hill to keep his service fee unchanged at \$15,000 (plus GST), but has led to a sizeable increase in mares booked to him this season, with Thompson expecting a return to three figures.

And the Waikato stud is tipping that to be

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reflected by exciting times on the track for Ace High.

"People are getting the hang of him a bit now, so he's really starting to build some momentum," Thompson told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"He's had Group 1 winners in his first two crops, and it's pretty **Continued on page 5**

Continued from page 3 exciting to be able to get those elite-level horses. And it wouldn't surprise me to see Blind Raise heading in the same direction, with the way he won on Saturday.

"He's got a lot of horses coming through the grades in New Zealand, with another nice winner for us at Ellerslie on Saturday in the mare Allaces, and he's certainly heading in the right direction.

"He's really starting to more than hit his straps. It's quite an exciting stage in his career really. He's certainly going to be a good stallion, but he could turn into a very good stallion, the way he's going."

While Allaces won her second of eight starts at Ellerslie on Saturday, Thompson was also heartened by the return to racing of She's A Dealer in the race named after Rich Hill's newly minted dual New Zealand champion sire, the Proisir Plate (Gr 1, 1400m).

The five-year-old mare, who ran fifth in the 2025 Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m), was having her first start since her lone Australian autumn run - a fifth in Randwick's JRA Plate (Gr 3, 2000m).

While finishing ninth in the Proisir, she travelled off the track and was forced extremely wide on the home turn but still ran through

the line, hinting she'd be better suited by the longer trip second-up in the middle leg of New Zealand's spring Triple Crown, the Howden Insurance Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) at Hastings.

The Busuttin-Young trained Blind Raise - part-owned by former New Zealand Test cricket captain Ken **Continued on page 7**

Continued from page 5 Rutherford - was shortened to the fourth line of betting at \$9 for the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) following Saturday's win.

And Grahame Begg's She's A Hustler is preparing to resume from a solid, if non-winning, autumn-winter campaign. The now six-year-old finished just off the pace in four runs highlighted by a fourth in Randwick's Queen Of The Turf Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) in her first try at the top level, and a third in the Hollindale Stakes (Gr 2, 1800m) at the Gold Coast.

"I heard She's A Hustler trialled really nicely the other day and they've got big hopes for her in the spring," Thompson said.

"And we were happy to see She's A Dealer

run how she did on Saturday. That'll top her off nicely for the Howden Insurance Mile."

Ace High's fillies have been outperforming his colts so far, with Blind Raise his only male stakes winner among six.

Thompson expects that to balance out, while conceding the stallion's stock appear to blossom as three-year-olds.

"I don't think there'll be any gender bias with the horse. He's had a lot of promising looking colts, and a lot of the better colts got sold to Hong Kong," he said. "But he's got reasonable numbers out there now, with four crops running.

Continued from page 7 While Ace High scored his top-level triumphs in the Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) and the VRC Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) of 2017, he's shown considerable versatility as a sire. His progeny's most successful distance bracket is 1201-1400 metres, with a winners to runners ratio of 40.17 per cent. Granted, that range holds a lion's share of races, but Thompson says the stat reflects that Ace High holds a powerful hand as a stallion.

"People might say that's a surprising amount of winners in that distance range for him, but if you look at his bloodlines - he's out of a Redoute's Choice mare, his second dam is by Sunday Silence, and he himself is by High

Chaparral. There's a helluva lot of versatility amongst that lot," Thompson said.

"Quite a few of his fillies have speed, which is not a surprise really.

"If you breed a fast mare to him you can get a fast horse, and if you breed a staying type of mare to him you can get a horse with stamina."

Thompson said Ace High's drop in coverings last year was not too surprising, but that normal service would resume this year for the stallion with a career fertility rate of 82 per cent through seven standing seasons.

"Last year happened because of the stage he was at going into the spring, and then the good horses - She's A Hustler, She's a Dealer and

Blind Raise - came through after the breeding season," he said.

"Breeders had been perhaps hanging off a little bit to see where he was heading, as can happen. Certainly they'll all be jumping back on board now.

"It's looking like he'll get around the 100 mark this spring. If things continue to go well we might get more."

Makybe return for Cup hero Half Yours

Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Half Yours (St Jean) will begin his path towards a title defence in Saturday week's Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Flemington. The Tony and Calvin McEvoy-trained son of St Jean (Teofilo) is being aimed at a defence of the Cup on November 3, and will have the services of Jamie Melham in the Makybe. Melham became the first female jockey to land the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) and Melbourne Cup double aboard the now six-year-old – who has taken in a pair of jumpouts ahead of his first-up assignment. "I was really happy with his trial," Tony McEvoy said. "If you put him in a 1000-metre race, he would get completely run off his legs and they

ran it like a race. It wasn't like a normal trial and he got chasing. They were also trials at Flemington where they finish on a bend, so it's very hard for horses to make ground on a bend. Whilst it didn't look impressive, I thought he moved well, trialled nicely and the horse is telling us he's going very well while his coat is coming better by the day. All the data that we collate on him is normal. He certainly hasn't gone backwards."

Potential Run To The Rose quartet for Waller

Champion trainer Chris Waller could send four colts to Saturday's Run To The Rose (Gr 2, 1200m) at Rosehill. Unbeaten Group 3 winner St Gotthard (Snitzel) could be joined by Fireball (Snitzel), Tron Bolt (Toronado) and Central Europe (Frankel) in the sprint. Three of the quartet had a race day workout at Randwick at the weekend, with only Central Europe not taking part. "They are lovely colts and all on the same path. They've got to try and win Group 1s in the spring," Waller said. "Most likely, they start at Rosehill in the Run To The Rose. It is an important starting point for our three. It is unavoidable [they clash]. The Golden Rose, Coolmore [Stud Stakes], big sprints, Caulfield Guineas and obviously big feature races in Sydney are in the plans. I would have liked to

have split him [Central Europe] and St Gotthard up with similar ownership. But I think Central Europe needs another sprint race before he gets out to 1400 metres."

House Of Cards set for Tuncurry Cup

Coffs Harbour-based trainer Brett Dodson has not yet fully committed to running House Of Cards (Exceed And Excel) in Friday's Tuncurry Cup (1600m), admitting he will wait to check the strength of the field before making a set decision. The six-year-old gelding hadn't won for 18 months prior to being handed over to Dodson, and has now won his last two starts, in the Casino Cup (1400m) and the Tuncurry Cup Prelude (1500m). "He's won three out of five for me, the other couple of races were a bit short for him and weren't suitable," Dodson told Racing NSW. "Every race that's suited him he's got the money, he's been very good. He's always had ability, looking at his form, maybe he just needed a change of environment. I've done a few things different with him and they seem to be working. It's a matter of mixing it up and he really responded to it. The big advantage is we know he can handle Tuncurry, it's a bit of a tricky track being a sand base and a lot of horses won't handle it. Now we know he does handle it."

Holder claims fourth John Letts Medal, McAvaney in HoF

Legendary sports broadcaster Bruce McAvaney OAM has been inducted into the South Australian Thoroughbred Racing Hall of Fame, with the South Australian Jockey Club also announcing that The Goodwood (Gr 1, 1200m) will be named in his honour.

McAvaney was inducted in the Associate category at the Sportsbet SA Racing Awards and Hall of Fame at Morphettville's Wolf Blass Event Centre on Saturday night.

South Australian Premier Peter Malinauskas attended the event and took part in the induction, recognising McAvaney's lifelong contribution to racing and South Australian sport.

The evening also saw Jason Holder claim his fourth John Letts Medal following an outstanding 2025/26 season in the saddle.

Holder added to his previous wins in 2013/14, 2015/16 and 2022/23, joining Jamie Melham as the most successful jockey in the history of the award.

The 51-year-old completed a clean sweep of South Australia's statewide and

metropolitan jockey premierships, riding 84 winners across the state – including 47 at metropolitan level.

Lauren Stojakovic's fairytale return to race riding was voted the inaugural winner of the SA Racing Most Memorable Moment Award. The Blue Diamond (Gr 1, 1200m)-winning jockey returned from more than eight years away from the saddle to win aboard Its'anotherbattle (Harry Angel) at Murray Bridge in her first ride back. Her comeback continued with victory aboard Brave Hustler (Anders) in the David Coles AM Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Morphettville in May.

The new award was decided by public vote and created to recognise the moments that captured the emotion, stories and spirit of South Australian racing throughout the season.

Mating Call (Brazen Beau) was crowned the 2025/26 Festival Hire South Australian Champion Racehorse of the Year, while Thunder Shoc (Vino Rosso) received the Evright.com South Australian Best Performed Racehorse Award.

Garret Lynch secured the statewide, provincial and country trainer premierships, while Phillip Stokes was crowned South Australian Metropolitan Trainer of the Year.

New Zealand

Thrilling finish to Taranaki staying feature

Cambridge visitor In A Pickle (Preferment) booked a possible trip to Warrnambool later in the season when he prevailed in the first of two Jericho Cup (4600m) qualifying contests after a thrilling home straight struggle at New Plymouth on Saturday. The NZB Airfreight Road To The Jericho (3210m) provides the winner with automatic entry into the Victorian contest, which is open to Australian and New Zealand-bred horses and commemorates the light horse involvement in World War I. Ridden by Rihaan Goyaram, In A Pickle proved game in success as he defeated Slick Chick (Reliable Man) by 0.1 lengths with a further six and a half lengths back to the third-placed Early Times (American Pharoah). "It was a really good win but looking ahead I'm not sure he is the right type of horse for a Jericho Cup, however that is not my decision, it is for the owners," winning trainer Ralph Manning said. "He can be pretty quirky and isn't a great traveller, so we haven't really taken him too far for his races. On his day he does have good ability, but he is the type that if he doesn't like something, including the rider, he just won't gallop. He even does it at trackwork. Rihaan gets on pretty well with him, so he can get him going along and doing his best. I thought it was a pretty good ride although I told him he was six inches from going too early, but as we got the photo in our favour, he was a genius."

Four for Siskin

Master Soarer (3 f ex Masterwork by Daiwa Major) became the fourth individual stakes winner for Siskin when landing Sunday's Shion Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) at Nakayama. Ridden by Takuya Ono for trainer Masayoshi Ebina, the three-year-old filly defeated Something Sweet (Saturnalia) by a half-length with a further length and a quarter back to Dream Core (Kizuna) in third place. Out of the winning Daiwa Major (Sunday Silence) mare Masterwork, Master Soarer is a half-brother to winners Meisterwerk

Unbeaten Well Written crowned New Zealand Horse of the Year

An unbeaten season, six consecutive victories and a string of outstanding performances have seen Well Written (Written Tycoon) crowned New Zealand's Horse of the Year for 2025-26.

The Cambridge mare claimed the sport's highest honour at the New Zealand Thoroughbred Horse of the Year Awards on Sunday evening, capping a flawless three-year-old campaign that established her as one of the country's most accomplished performers in recent times.

Well Written was also named Champion Three-Year-Old, after a season that saw her win all six of her starts, including a stunning six-length victory in the \$1.5 million TAB Karaka Millions 3YO (Listed, 1600m).

Well Written is the only New Zealand Champion Three-Year-Old this century to be unbeaten at three, and in a fitting conclusion to a remarkable weekend, Well Written also claimed the \$400,000 Proisir Plate (Gr 1, 1400m) at Ellerslie on Saturday, defeating older rivals in the first Group 1 race of the new season.

Lara Antipova (Russian Revolution) was crowned Champion Two-Year-Old – completing an unbeaten four-start juvenile season highlighted by victories in the \$550,000 Sistema Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and two Group 2 contests.

The Champion Sprinter-Miler title went to the rapidly emerging First Five (Almanzor), while five-time Group 1-winning mare Legarto (Proisir) collected

her second Champion Middle Distance Horse. Trans-Tasman Group 1 Oaks winner Ohope Wins (Ocean Park) was recognised as Champion Stayer, and Champion Jumper went to Jesko (Atlante).

Craig Grylls was named Jockey of the Year after claiming a second consecutive New Zealand Jockeys' Premiership, while Hamish McNeill secured his first Jumps Jockey of the Year honour. Te Akau Racing's Mark Walker and Sam Bergerson were again named Trainer of the Year.

The Owner of the Year Award went to international racing and breeding powerhouse Yulong Investments, while the LOVERACING.NZ Award for Contribution to Media, Digital & Content was presented to Trackside NZ senior content producer George Bates. Zac Harkess took out the NZ Stablehand of the Year Award.

Two of the evening's most significant honours were NZTR's Special Awards, recognising outstanding contributions to the Thoroughbred industry. The NZTR Award for Outstanding Contribution to Racing went to the Williams family, represented by three generations of the family, including Sam and Dame Catriona Williams, Richard "Buzz" and Susie Williams, and Tom and Gay Williams. Their involvement in Thoroughbred breeding and racing spans three generations and more than 85 years, with Little Avondale Stud now home to Champion sire Per Incanto (Street Cry), who won both the Dewar and Centaine Awards for the 2025-26 season.

The late Savabeel (Zabeel) was named the 2026 recipient of the NZTR Award for Outstanding Global Achievement, recognising an extraordinary legacy on the track and at stud.

(Drefong) and Mon Biscuit (Mind Your Biscuits). Siskin stood the 2026 northern hemisphere breeding season at Shadai Stallion Station for a fee of ¥4,000,000 (approx. AU\$35,480).

JPN: Daughter of Lys Gracieux makes winning debut

Lys Gloire (Saturnalia), a daughter of 2019 Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m)-winning mare Lys Gracieux (Heart's Cry), made a winning debut at Hanshin on Sunday. Ridden by Damian Lane in the 1800-metre contest, the Yoshito Yahagi-trained juvenile scored by a length over Heart Note (Efforia) with a further half-length back to Gaya's Amore (Maurice) in third place.

JPN: Throat issue slows Fast Network in Centaur Stakes

Fast Network's two-race campaign in Japan could be over after the six-year-old finished 15th in the Centaur Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Hanshin on Sunday, with trainer Dennis Yip blaming a recurring throat issue. Twice Group 1-placed Fast Network settled on the pace from barrier eight as tearaway leader, Puro Magic, strode lengths in front of the main group. Flicker Jab, a clear second throughout, rallied past Puro Magic over the final 50m to prevail by one length. Group 1 winner Mama Cocha was third as Fast Network faded under jockey Damian Lane. Yip said: "He jumped well, but he only just stayed on over the last 200 (metres). I scoped him after the race and he has had the problem before, but maybe this time, it's come again – it's very disappointing. He's fine back in the stables but it was just over the last 200 in the race, he can't breathe. He travelled well and everything was good, but when he asked him, he had the issue."

KOR: No repeat for Hong Kong in Korea Sprint

There was no repeat Korea Sprint (Gr 3, 1200m) victory for Hong Kong at Seoul Racecourse on Sunday afternoon, with Japan dominating the race and Gorgeous Win (Press Statement) the first Sha Tin-based galloper home in fifth. Hong Kong launched a three-pronged attack on Korea's premier sprint after Self Improvement's (Deep Field) victory in the race 12 months ago, but it was Japanese pair Dragon Welds (Frosted) and American Stage (Into Mischief) who fought out a ding-dong battle down the home straight before the former prevailed by two lengths as the \$1.8 favourite. Danny Shum's Gorgeous Win travelled the handiest of the Hong Kong trio under Richard Kingscote, tracking the leading pack into the straight and at one point looking likely to threaten the top four before crossing the line in fifth, seven-and-a-quarter lengths off the winner. "He ran a great race," said Kingscote of the 22/1 chance, who jumped from the outside gate of 16. "Danny's team had him in good nick, and I thought the application of the eye shields was a very good idea. It's not a surface the horse is used to, and I thought they were very helpful with us being in the kickback. The horse did everything right, ran strongly all the way to the line and I was happy with him."



International

First for Pinatubo

Darley shuttler Pinatubo (Shamardal) registered his first elite-level winner on Sunday when the Roger Varian-trained Saddadd (4 c ex Talmada by Cape Cross) took out the Grosser Preis von Baden (Gr 1, 2400m) at Baden-Baden. Ridden by Jack Mitchell, the four-year-old entire proved a half-length too strong for Parachutiste (Dubawi) with a further two lengths back to Bright Light (City Light) in third place. Bred by Godolphin and raced by Sheikh Ahmed Al MaktoumChevron, Saddadd is closely related to fellow Group 1 winner Almaqam (Lope De Vega) and a half-brother to Listed-placed winner Saleymm (Dubawi) being the third foal out of the Listed-winning Cape Cross (Green Desert) mare

Talmada. Pinatubo has shuttled back to Darley's Kelvinside base for the 2026 season where he is standing at a fee of \$27,500 (inc GST).

Five for Caravaggio

Erdenali (3 g ex Erdana by Sea The Stars) became the fifth individual elite-level winner for Caravaggio (Scat Daddy) on Sunday when landing the Prix du Moulin (Gr 1, 1600m) at Longchamp. Ridden by Mickael Barzalona for trainer Francis Graffard, the three-year-old gelding came with a strong late run and kept on well to deny Ten Bob Tony (Night Of Thunder) by a length and a quarter with a further three lengths back to the odds-on favourite Gstaad (Starspangledbanner) in third. Bred and raced by the Aga Khan Studs, Erdenali is the first foal out of the Sea The Stars (Cape Cross) mare Erdana, herself a half-sister to Group 2 winner Erevann (Dubawi) and out of triple Group 1 winner Ervedya (Siyouni). Caravaggio stood the 2026 northern hemisphere breeding season at JBBA Shizunai Stallion Station for a fee of ¥3,000,000 (approx. AU\$26,610).

FR: Friendly Soul grabs second Longchamp Group 1

The John and Thady Gosden-trained Friendly Soul (5 m Kingman - In Clover by Inchinor) bagged her second French Group 1 success on Sunday when capturing the Prix Vermeille (Gr 1, 2400m) at Longchamp. Making all under James Doyle, the mare was clear turning for home and, although seeing her margin dwindle with each 50 metres, held on well for a strong three-quarter lengths victory over Pink Panthera (Chachnak). There was a further neck back to the third-placed Sunly (Night Of Thunder). The win added to Friendly Soul's success in the 2024 Prix de l'Opera (Gr 1, 2000m), also held at Longchamp.

26 for Sioux Nation

Rogue Passion (2 f ex Vazire by Frankel) became the 26th individual stakes winner for Coolmore's former shuttler Sioux Nation (Scat Daddy) when landing Sunday's Prix d'Aumale (Gr 2, 1600m) at Longchamp. Ridden by Rossa Ryan for trainer Ed Bethell, the filly stayed on well inside the final 200 metres to lead close to home and beat Amusingly (No Nay Never) by a neck. There

was a further three and a half lengths back to Data (Lope De Vega) in third place, who was short of room at a crucial stage of the race. FR: Avec Toi narrowly maintains unbeaten record

The Christopher Head-trained Avec Toi (2 c No Nay Never - La Joconde by Frankel) stretched his unbeaten run to four on Sunday when narrowly scoring in the Prix la Rochette (Gr 3, 1400m) at Longchamp. Sent off the long odds-on favourite, the juvenile son of No Nay Never (Scat Daddy) made all and was pushed all the way to the line by Imperial Strike (Lucky Vega) but prevailed by a short-head under jockey Pierre-Charles Boudot. There was a further three and a half lengths back to the third-placed Aralia (Muhaarar).

16 for Hello Youmzain

Extremely Zain (3 c ex Alone by Galileo) became the 16th individual stakes winner for Cambridge Stud shuttler Hello Youmzain (Kodiac) when taking out Sunday's Garrowby Stakes (Listed, 6f) at York. Ridden by Cieren Fallon for trainer William Haggas, the three-year-old colt defeated Double Rush (Blue Point) by a half-length with the same distance further back to Dickensian (Pinatubo) in third. Taylor Made Farm stallion Early Voting (Gun Runner) was provided with his first elite-level winner on Saturday when the Bob Baffert-trained Miss Monica (2 f ex Lipstikliesnlovers

Ridden by Juan J Hernandez, the filly ran out a comfortable six and a quarter lengths winner over Crazy Hot Mess (Pinehurst) with a further length and a half back to Holmby (Corniche) in third. Ridden by Juan J Hernandez for trainer Jonathan Thomas, the colt proved three-quarters of a length too strong for Shadow Nation (Sioux Nation). There was a further length back to the third-placed Off In The Corner (Karakontie). Bred by Hartwell Farm Inc, Observed was purchased by his owners Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, Bridlewood Farm and Robert V Lapenta for US\$240,000 at the 2025 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Out of the unraced First Defence (Unbridled's Song) mare Overseen, he is a half-brother to Grade 3 winner Call Me Midnight (Midnight Lute). Mandaloun stood the 2026 northern hemisphere breeding season for a fee of US\$10,000 (approx. AU\$13,890).

31 for Tiz The Law

Ashford Stud stallion Tiz The Law (Constitution) chalked up his 31st individual stakes winner on Saturday when the Miguel Clement-trained Caroline St. Beat (3 c ex Myhartblongstodady by Scat Daddy) landed the Nashville Derby Invitational (Gr 2, 10.5f) at Kentucky Downs. Ridden by Tyler Gaffalione, the three-year-old colt defeated UK raider Glacius (Too Darn Hot) by a length and a quarter. There was a further three and a quarter lengths back to Go Grey (Knicks Go) in third place. Bred by Lawrence

Goichman, Caroline St. Beat was purchased for US\$100,000 by Christophe Clement at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga NY Yearling Sale and races for Madaket Stables LLC and Steven Bouche. He is the only foal to race out of the stakes-winning Scat Daddy (Johannesburg) mare Myhartblongstodady. Tiz The Law stood the 2026 northern hemisphere breeding season for a fee of US\$40,000 (approx. AU\$55,560).

US: Tiffany lands successful raid in Turf Cup

British raider Tiffany (6 m Farhh - Affinity by Sadler's Wells) landed her connections a huge payday when she ran out the winner of Saturday's Kentucky Turf Cup Invitational (Gr 2, 12f) at Kentucky Downs. Taking home the first prize of over £880,000 (approx. AU\$1.65 million), the Sir Mark Prescott-trained daughter of Farhh (Pivotal) led inside the final furlong and readily defeated Irish runner Ethical Diamond (Awtaad) by a length and three-quarters. Fellow UK raider Fort George (Territories) finished a further two and a quarter lengths back in third. The win backed up Tiffany's top-level success in the Grosser Preis von Berlin (Gr 1, 2400m) on her start prior.

GER: Sea The Stars filly tops strong BBAG sale

A Sea The Stars filly topped the BBAG Yearling Sale at Baden-Baden when selling to Jeremy Brummitt for €600,000 (approx. AU\$968,220) on behalf of Newsells Park Racing Syndicate 27. Offered by Gestüt Ebbesloh in its centenary year, she is the second foal out of Group 3 winner Sconset (Soldier Hollow), whose first foal Santa Catarina (Zarak) is already a Group 3 winner. Juddmonte also made its first purchase at BBAG, paying €460,000 (approx. AU\$742,300) for Gestüt Röttgen's Frankel (Galileo) colt out of Wellenspiel, the dam of four Stakes winners including German Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winners Windstoss (Shirocco) and Weltstar (Soldier Hollow). William Haggas was among the British and Irish visitors attending the sale for the first time. An international buying bench helped turnover on the 227 strong catalogue rise 15 per cent to €9.316 million (approx. AU\$15 million), while the clearance rate improved four points to 81 per cent.

Ka Ying Rising primed for The Everest after setting fifth 1200m Sha Tin course record

David Hayes declared Ka Ying Rising (Shamexpress) “bigger, stronger and better” as the world’s best sprinter shattered Sha Tin’s 1200-metre track record for the fifth time before immediately entering quarantine on Sunday in preparation for a defence of The Everest (Gr 1, 1200m) in Sydney next month.

Clocking a blistering 1m 06.11s to destroy his own 1200-metre record by almost a second, Ka Ying Rising stretched his winning streak to a Hong Kong record 21 consecutive wins and claimed a third Chief Executive’s Cup Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) under Zac Purton, prompting Hayes to describe the victory as one of the six-year-old’s finest.

“He spent five or six hours under veterinary attention on Tuesday to have the bruising in his hind leg checked out,” Hayes said. “He was having CT scans and Doppler scans under sedation. That would throw most horses off their routine, but he just takes everything in his stride – and then comes out and breaks the track record again.

“Zac basically eased down in the same race last year for the last 200 metres, and he let him run to the line today. He hasn’t been let run to the line many times, and of course he smashed his own record – and you don’t see that very often – by [almost] a second.

“He’s 29lb heavier [1,172lb] than [he was when he set] last season’s track record time and probably nine [pounds] above his best winning weight, so he’s got bigger, stronger and better.”

Posting one of the most dynamic performances of his mercurial career, Ka Ying Rising improved his overall record to 22 wins and two seconds from 24 starts with prize-money of HK\$160,923,900 (approx. AU\$).

Conceding most of his rivals 20lb, Ka Ying Rising forged straight to the lead and ran 23.27s for the first 400 metres, a searing 21.15s between the 800 metres and 400 metres before

closing off the final 400 metres in 21.69s to defeat Copartner Prance (Epaulette) by seven and three-quarter lengths. Magic Control (Sioux Nation) was third, a further length-and-a-half back.

Both Hayes and Purton predicted Ka Ying Rising was capable of improvement this season despite finishing last preparation with three record-breaking runs in succession – running 1m 19.36s in the Queen’s Silver Jubilee Cup (Gr 1, 1400m), 1m 07.12s in the Sprint Cup (Gr 2, 1200m) and 1m 07.10s in the Chairman’s Sprint Prize (Gr 1, 1200m).

The superstar first broke Sacred Kingdom’s (Encosta De Lago) longstanding Sha Tin 1200-metre mark of 1m 07.50s with a gallop of 1m 07.43s in the Jockey Club Sprint (Gr 2, 1200m) in 2024 before lowering it to 1m 07.20s in the 2025 Centenary Sprint Cup.

Remarkably, Hayes believes the Shamexpress (O’Reilly) gelding is still open to further development after he was allowed to coast over the final 100 metres today while lowering the course record by 0.99s.

Purton agreed: “We’ve both said that he’s a bigger, stronger horse and that didn’t mean he came back fat. He came back physically more developed and stronger and he’s feeling great.

He hasn’t raced since April, so any amount of racing is going to improve him.

“I’m not going to stand there and say he’s going to improve lengths off that – and I said before, he doesn’t need to – but I’m sure he’s going to pull up better for the run.

“When I pulled up, I was interested to see what time he run because the track was very fast during the barrier trials here last week; it’s firm out there today, and they ran a good time in the first race.

“I sort of let him really get into his rhythm and I asked him for an effort, so I just wanted to see where we were at and, obviously, we’re in a good place.”

Hayes added: “There could be people out there saying he beat nothing but a few of those horses have won 20 or 25 million Hong Kong dollars. They’re well-rated horses. They’re Group horses around the world, but they don’t look it when they race him. They get taken out of their comfort zone.”

Ka Ying Rising entered quarantine less than two hours after caning his opposition, and Hayes is confident the sprinter will be fitter this year when he contests AU\$20 million The Everest than he was when triumphing in the world’s richest turf race in 2025.

"We had him far too fresh arriving in Sydney. I don't like to change much when they win like that, so we'll just continue with a bit more base work and that's holding him in better stead for when he arrives [in Sydney], mentally. It's more about mentally not arriving too fresh," Hayes said.

"I have no fears because he thrives at Canterbury and he did well here [in quarantine]."

Ka Ying Rising was one of three horses to excel in the fast conditions at Sha Tin on Sunday.

Good Fortune (Darci Brahma) posted a new class record of 1m 08.59s in the Class 5 Glenealy Handicap (1200m) for Pierre Ng and Nichola Yuen, before Danny Shum's General Smart (Shamus Award) clocked a new class record of 1m 33.91s in landing the Class 5 Harcourt Handicap (1600m) under Andrea Atzeni.

Shum also combined with Purton to clinch the Class 4 Duddell Handicap (1000m) with

Lightness Of Music (Press Statement) before David Eustace and Luke Ferraris teamed with Light Years Glory (Advertise) to win the second section of the Class 4 Edinburgh Handicap (1200m).

Francis Lui's talented Baby Sakura (Tagaloo) remains on course for a tilt at the Four-Year-Old Classic Series with a dogged win under Vincent Ho in the Class 3 Cotton Tree Handicap (1400m).

Securing his fourth win from seven starts, the Tagaloo (Lord Kanaloo) gelding is being aimed at the Hong Kong Classic Mile (Listed, 1600m) on January 31.

Atzeni sealed a double aboard John Size's Spicy Standard (Pierata) in the first section of the Class 4 Edinburgh Handicap (1200m) before Matthew Chadwick coaxed the best out of 104/1 chance Sing Dragon (Written Tycoon) to win the Class 2 Albert Handicap (1400m) for Chris So.

Hugh Bowman and Mark Newnham opened their seasonal accounts with Joyful
